The National Year of Reading 2026

The National Year of Reading 2026 'Go All In' is a UK-wide campaign designed to inspire more people to make reading a regular part of their lives.

To support the initiative, we are expanding our **Schools Programme** to engage and inspire 5,000+ children and young people across Kirklees to read and be creative, and piloting a new **Reading Warriors** scheme at Crow Lane Primary School. We are grateful to One17 Charitable Trust for sponsoring some of our workshops.

We are also working with youth worker Tashan Gabriel on a project for the after-school club at **Empower Movement & Wellbeing**. **What's Your Aura?** will showcase the talents of a group of young people as they create characters and write a short performance piece, which will be staged and recorded at the gym.
